Salmon Bake 2010

The Shorewood Salmon Bake 2010 was a great event attended by over 150 community members. Participants enjoyed 120 pounds of Salmon. This year we were able to enjoy Wild Caught Red King Salmon and White King Salmon. The White King Salmon was caught in the Straits of San Juan, and the Red King Salmon was caught in the pristine waters of Alaska. The salmon was prepared in two different and scrumptious styles. There was the traditional bar-b-qued salmon with the Soy Sauce with Olive Oil marinade. Rosemary branches were added to the coals for scent. The second style was the Johnny's Seasoning Salt rub on a hot griddle for a blackened crisp covering. It was definitely noticed that a number of Salmon Bakers tried all four styles of fish.

In addition to the Salmon, also offered were potato salad, baked beans, three bean salad, cold slaw, veggies, fruit, watermelon, cornbread muffins, ice cream, cookies, and water.

Forest Stewardship

Please be a good neighbor to your neighborhood forest...

Are you a neighbor of Salmon Creek Ravine, Seahurst Park or Shorewood Park? These park lands are Burien's natural treasures and home to many native species of plants, birds and animals.



Lawn clippings and yard waste may seem harmless, but piles of this kind of waste can kill everything they cover, including tree roots. They may also present a fire hazard, attract rodents, or contribute to the instability of slopes. Heaps of yard waste provide habitat for invasive plants such as Scot's Broom, Himalayan Blackberry and Eurasian Knotweed. Yard waste can be composted, used as mulch for your landscape, or disposed of through the "clean green" yard waste service.

Cutting, pruning or trimming of trees or plants on park property is not allowed EXCEPT by permit. Trees are an invaluable asset to the beauty and health of our park system. Untrained "topping" or "chopping" to improve a view, or for any other reason, can permanently damage or kill a tree. If you have questions, please contact me at 206-200-7524.
