### Message from our Ecology Chairperson

Students from New Start High School have been working with the City of Burien and the Environmental Science Center (ESC) to restore the Salmon Creek ravine area. They are removing invasive plants and learning about environmental habitat issues as part of the project.

Teacher **Bev Mowrer** is using this real-life learning opportunity to teach science. "The students are

continuing this plant project by doing an intensive threeweek *power session* on invasive versus native plants."

The students are removing the Himalayan blackberry along the hillsides in Salmon Creek Park and will be replanting the slope with native plants propagated in their school nursery. They are also helping remove invasive blackberry and ivy along the stream in Salmon Creek ravine.

"This has been a fantastic partnership between the City of Burien, the non-profit Environmental Science Center, and Highline Public Schools' New Start High School, says Lisa Aumann, Burien Adopt-a-Park Coordinator. "We look forward to building on this initial project's success and hope to work on some additional collaborative arrangements in the coming year. This project provided a positive outcome for all the organizations involved. We appreciate all the hard work teacher Beverly Mowrer and, more importantly her students, provided to the Burien Community."

The city's role is providing guidance for the outdoor work, some tools, and transportation. The ESC volunteers are helping with classroom education as well as helping provide additional on-site coordination of the students' field work.
