Scott says the primary goal of this leadership project has been to help remind people that trash and other waste entering the drains ultimately ends up in Puget Sound. Another goal though was more personal: Completion of this task helps him to qualify for the rank of Eagle Scout.

Getting advance approval for this endeavor from the Chief Seattle Council of Scouting's Aquila district was needed to qualify this as Scott's Eagle Scout project. He also had to get approval from the city of Burien and pitched it to the SOTS Board and got their approval (and a \$130 donation for materials) before he began as well. Somewhere along the line I suspect he needed a nod from Larry Malchodi too. Not much goes on in Scouting around here without Larry being involved.
