Upcoming Improvements and Request for Volunteers

Stair Upgrade Update (Apr – Aug)

Safe access to our beach is very important and the Board is taking steps (literally) to create access for all. We have a budget line item for \$5,000 for the stair project. We wanted to update you on the vision and project timeline. Jon Newton, the project manager, has been to the City of Burien (COB) for the "Pre-Pre Meeting" to make sure we understand the policies and procedures. We are in two restricted zones on the beach, so have additional steps in the process, nothing

of concern. In the ideal world the project will be completed in time for the Salmon Bake. Based on the results of further meeting with COB, we will determine if we will contract the job or DYI with the awesome Community Members we have. Either way, construction will be short to maintain beach access. The stairs will be evenly spaced vertically (run) and horizontally (rise), wide enough and with handrails for adults and children to safely navigate the stairs. Side protection is based on current code. We plan on a landing at the foot of the stairs, where the current gate is. The height is about 3 feet above ground at gate level. We will connect the landing and trail with a gradual ramp with side protection extending down and merging with the trail. A bench area is incorporated into the landing as a resting point. We are looking at materials that will be durable and low maintenance with an expected life cycle in the 10+ year range. The current chain link fence and gate will likely be removed during the build since they are no longer needed with the code access gates.

Picnic Table Refresh

On a separate project, the path, in-ground stairs, and railing will be maintained as is, with a few improvements as needed. The three picnic tables will receive new benches and tops. The removed wood will be repurposed to build additional benches on the beach. We will drill an umbrella hole in each table so you can bring your own umbrella.

Volunteers

We are looking for a list of volunteers with skills, tools, and the heart to help where needed on these projects. The timeline is not set, but if you would like to volunteer, please contact Jon Newton through the SOTS website. He will stay in contact as the process moves on and we transition to the build phase. We are excited to create better access for you to our most used resource, our SOTS beach, where we all can enjoy walks, picnics, SOTS events (Easter Egg Hunt, Salmon Bake), and just sitting and thinking sometimes.
